ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS/ PROCESS

Phase I

1. The applicant must submit an Online Application with a non-refundable Application Fee of \$100.00.
2. Applicant must be a Licensed Practical Nurse with a current license in good standing and qualified to practice nursing in the State of Virginia.
3. Applicant must provide evidence of high school completion by submitting an official high school transcript, a GED Certificate, a Postsecondary degree transcript, or a transcript showing successful completion of at least 60 semester transferable credit hours.
4. Applicant must submit official college transcripts with required prerequisite courses. Applicant must complete the following prerequisite courses with a "C" or better from an Institution of Higher Learning accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education:
 - a. Anatomy & Physiology I**
 - b. Anatomy & Physiology II**
 - c. Microbiology**
 - d. College Psychology
 - e. College Mathematics
 - f. College English Composition
 - g. Speech/Public Speaking/Communication**Science Prerequisites must be completed within 10 years of admission date.

NOTE: International Transcripts: Non-U.S. transcripts of secondary and/or post-secondary education must be evaluated by a foreign credential evaluation service to determine their U.S. equivalency.

5. Applicants must complete an entrance exam either the TEAS exam and score at "proficiency level" or better; or take the HESI LPN to ADN exam and score a "750". The exam is provided by Standard. Applicants may take an exam twice in each admission cycle.
6. Applicants must attend an admissions interview.
7. Pending the receipt and review of the above documents by the established time frame and once accepted, the applicant will be notified in writing.

Phase II

1. Applicants must successfully complete the Fundamental Nursing Skills and Concepts Validation Course. There is a \$1295 cost to take the Course, which is not covered by financial aid.

2. Complete criminal background check (school will give you the information)
3. Complete and submit Physical Exam, required immunizations, and TB testing
4. Submit American Heart BLS CPR certificate

APPLICATION SUBMISSION DEADLINE

Application form, application required documents and official transcripts must be received by **deadline** June 30th, 2021 to be considered for admission in August 17th, 2021 Fall Program.

Acceptance/Rejection letters will be sent to applicants by the 3rd week in July 2021.

Clinical Schedule:

Due to the competitive nature of clinical placement and to ensure appropriate and adequate clinical experiences, clinical sessions may be held on weekdays, weekends, and evenings. Clinical assignments are based on clinical agency availability as determined by the agency. Clinical sessions are held in Virginia, Maryland, and Washington D.C. Students must be flexible regarding clinical schedule.

Recommended Study Time: A basic rule for any degree is that you want to spend the same number of hours studying per week as you are in class. Since you will be taking 16 hours of classes each week, you should be studying 16 hours per week at a minimum. Depending on the difficulty level of the course you are taking you, may need to study more than 16 hours weekly.

Recommended Hours of Work: The LPN to RN Program is rigorous. It demands time and flexibility. The number of hours a student can work is dependent on the individual. We strongly recommended that students work no more than 32 hours a week.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Standard College trains and educates students for careers in the healthcare field as Registered Nurses in the LPN to RN Transition Program. Upon successful completion of the requirements of this program and after passing the NCLEX-RN licensure exam, the

graduate will have the knowledge, skills and values necessary to seek employment as a Registered Nurse in a variety of health care settings.

ATI TEAS – PRE-ADMISSION TEST

The Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS®) administered by Assessment Technologies Institute (ATI) is a standardized, timed, computer-based exam designed to assess the general academic preparedness of applicants interested in applying to the LPN to RN Transition Program. The exam measures knowledge in basic essential skills in the academic content areas of Reading, Mathematics, Science and English. The exam takes approximately 3.5 hours to complete and will be taken on a computer. NOTE: Calculators are not allowed on this exam.

1. Applicants must score at "Proficiency level" or better on the TEAS Test to be considered for admission to the LPN to RN Transition Program.
2. Go to atitesting.com and click on 'Register for TEAS'
3. Create an account or log in if you have one
4. On the left-hand side, you will see a grey column titled 'Register For...' Click on 'TEAS' From there you may search for a testing center. Please note that many are doing remote testing and that you may take it from an institution that is out-of-state. You can check whether a location will accept you by clicking on the 'learn more' button to the right of the institution's name on the list.
5. The TEAS Test is valid for 2 years.
6. The cost to take the ATI TEAS exam varies based upon location.

HESI – PRE-ADMISSION TEST

The school will be transitioning from the ATI TEAS VI Test to the HESI LPN to ADN entrance exam however, we will still be accepting the TEAS VI Test for the Fall 2021 Session.

The HESI LPN to ADN entrance exam is a 75-item nursing exam for Licensed Practical nurses seeking entrance into the LPN to RN Transition program. Students are given up to 2 hours to take the Exam. Study Materials: NCLEX PN book or PN Course Textbooks
