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PRACTICAL NURSING PROGRAM

The Practical Nursing Program offers Day, Evening, and Weekend Programs.

An **Evening Program** is usually held in April and September each year. Classes meet Monday-Thursday, 4 pm- 10 pm. The program runs about 14 months.

A **Morning Program** is usually held in January and July each year. Classes meet Monday-Thursday, 8:00 am -2:00 pm. The program runs about 14 months.

A **Weekend Program** is usually held in November each year. Classes meet Fridays, 4:00 pm to 10:00 pm., Saturdays, 8:00 am to 2:00 pm and Sundays, 2:00 pm to 8:00 pm. The program runs about 18 months.

The Program consists of three terms.

Students take one course at a time and must pass each course in order to proceed to the next course.

A student passes a course with a grade of 79.5% or higher.

Students receive a diploma upon graduating from the Program.

Course lectures in the Practical Nursing are held online. Students return to campus to participate in the Skills Lab and to sit for some exams. Students must have regular access to a computer with a camera and internet access in order to successfully participate in the program.

COVID-19 Vaccine Policy

The Clinical Practicum is a mandatory part of the Program. Students must be flexible regarding the clinical schedule. Clinicals may be held on weekdays, weekends, or evenings. Prior to participating at the clinical facility, students must submit Health Requirements Forms, Criminal and Drug Background Checks, and a CPR card from the American Heart Association.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Complete the online application, along with the \$75.00 nonrefundable application fee
 - The online application includes three (3) written references:
 - One (1) work reference
 - Two (2) character references not related to the applicant.
- Submit Proof of US High School Education or Equivalent plus GPA/grade average
 - Official High School Transcript or GED transcript, or
 - Official College Transcript (Minimum 60 credits transferable to an Associate's Degree), or
 - Official Evaluation Report. Students who attended high school outside the U.S. must request to have his/her foreign credentials sent to an evaluation agency. The official evaluation report must be sent from an agency recognized by Standard College. A list of recognized evaluation agencies can be found on our website.
- Pass Entrance Exam.
- Attend admission interview.
- Attend mandatory orientation

Students must complete the admission requirements prior to the program deadline in order to be considered for the Program. The College receives more applicants timely completing the process than there are spots available, and accordingly, admission to the Program is not guaranteed.

ENTRANCE EXAM

The Entrance Exam is a two-hour test, containing Math and Reading questions. Sample questions are provided after submitting the application. Students have one attempt to pass each section with a score of 75% or above in order to pass the Exam. If a student doesn't pass the Exam, the student may reapply to a Program with a different start date. **Applicants will receive a link to schedule their placement exam once they submit an application online.**

INTERVIEW

An interview will be scheduled with the Admissions Office after passing the Entrance Exam. At the interview, you will be provided with comprehensive information on the Program and complete an Interview Form.

The total cost for the Practical Nursing is \$25,633.54

The total cost covers all tuition fees and E-books.

A flexible payment plan is available for tuition and school fees.

We accept credit card payment and personal checks.
