Description of Facilities

On November 4, 2025, Standard College relocated to its new main campus at 8230 Leesburg Pike, Suite 500, Vienna, Virginia, 22182. The new facility comprises 19,635 square feet—more than 1,000 square feet larger than the previous location—and provides expanded space for instruction, administration, and student support services. Standard College also utilizes a temporary secondary facility, located at 1950 Old Gallows Road, suite 520, Vienna, VA 22182, which is within reasonable walking distance of the main campus and operates as an extension of the main campus.

Due to relocation and construction-related issues that temporarily affected the availability of certain instructional spaces, specifically the Skills Lab and classrooms, the College secured the secondary facility on a temporary basis to ensure uninterrupted academic progress and maintain program quality. The facility, less than one mile from the main campus, is used exclusively for skills laboratory instruction and on-campus testing.

Since the relocation, students have utilized the main campus for administrative services, library access, cafeteria and student lounge facilities. Course lectures continue to be delivered remotely, and clinical practicums are completed at approved local healthcare facilities in accordance with program requirements. By strategically leveraging both locations, Standard College has maintained continuity of instruction, program delivery, and student support services while completing the final phases of its campus transition and facility improvements.

Campus Layout and Accessibility

The new campus is located on a single floor, ensuring accessibility and ease of movement. Multiple entrances and exits support efficient circulation for students, staff, and faculty. A large, free parking lot is located adjacent to the building on the P4 level, providing convenient access to the campus. In addition, the campus is easily accessible by public transportation and is located within walking distance to nearby Metro and bus routes, supporting convenient commuting for students and employees.

General Description

The new campus entrance opens into a lobby with a reception area, staffed by two (2) administrative assistants. Adjacent areas include a copy/print room and secure records storage. A central hallway leads to individual administrative offices, which house the President/CEO, the Deputy Executive Director, the Director of Education, the Assistant Director of Education, Director of Clinical, three (3) Admission Officers, the Director of Compliance, the Registrar, the Financial Aid Department, the Business Office,

and Facility Operations. All administrative and support staff are provided with private offices equipped with a desk, telephone, task chair, guest chairs, and computer. Secure access to administrative areas is provided through a key card system.

Classrooms

The new campus will include four (4) large classrooms, with seating for approximately fifty (50) students in two (2) rooms and seating for thirty (30) to forty (40) students in the remaining classrooms. All the classrooms will have Wi-Fi enabled and equipped with audio-visual equipment and anatomical learning models. Each classroom will have a desk at the front, whiteboard, projector, smart TV, and a computer. Desks will consist of one seat per table. There will be multiple power ports for plugging in laptops. Each classroom will be designed to support interactive instruction and meets institutional and programmatic requirements for nursing education. Students evaluate the physical facilities annually as part of the College's course evaluation process. At the previous campus, students consistently reported satisfaction with the quality and adequacy of instructional spaces.

At the secondary facility, three (3) classrooms are dedicated to Skills Laboratory instruction. These classrooms are configured to accommodate hands-on skills practice and house Skills Laboratory equipment and patient care models. The instructional environment at the secondary facility is consistent with the quality and functionality of the previous campus classrooms and supports uninterrupted delivery of program objectives.

Skills Laboratory

The new campus will include Skills Learning Laboratories designed to provide students with maximum opportunity to develop and practice essential nursing competencies. Two (2) Skills Laboratories and two (2) Simulation Laboratories will be shared between the LPN-to-RN Transition and Practical Nursing programs. The Skills Laboratories will contain ten (10) Stryker Secure II 3002 Hospital Patient Beds with overbed and bedside tables, representing an increase from the previous campus. Each bed area will be configured to simulate a hospital room environment and includes headboards, wall-mounted sharps containers, and blood pressure devices.

The laboratories will be equipped with ten (10) task-training mannequins for practicing skills such as personal care, tracheostomy care, suctioning, wound care, catheterization, injections, IV insertion, and nasogastric tube placement. Additional task-training models will be available for IV therapy, urinary catheterization, central line care, injections, breast examinations, chest tube insertion, and wound management.

The Skills Laboratories will be supplied with adequate materials and equipment to meet course learning objectives. Qualified faculty members will provide supervision, demonstration, evaluation, and individualized feedback during scheduled laboratory sessions. Open lab hours will be available outside of scheduled classes, and students may schedule additional practice time with the Skills Laboratory Coordinator.

At the secondary temporary facility, there are two Skills Laboratories housing four (4) simulated patient care beds. Each bed area is configured to simulate a hospital room environment and includes headboards, sharps containers, and blood pressure devices. The Skills Laboratories are supplied with adequate materials and equipment to meet course learning objectives. Faculty supervision, evaluation standards, and instructional practices at the secondary site replicate those implemented at the previous campus, ensuring continuity and quality of training.

Computer Lab

The new campus will include one large computer lab with 46 stations for students to use. Each station will contain a computer, keyboard, desk, and chair. Students will take mid-course and final exams in the Computer Lab in each course of the program, other than the NUR 403 Integrated Concepts course. In the NUR 403 Integrated Concepts course, students will sit for all lesson exams, mid-course exam, and final exams on campus in the Computer Lab.

The Computer Lab will be available for students to use Monday-Friday from 9:00 am – 5:00 pm, with the exception of times when testing is administered in the Lab. The campus will have wireless capabilities throughout, making it convenient for students to use their laptops for class and/or studying purposes in classrooms and the lounge areas, in addition to the Computer Lab.

At the temporary facility, a large computer laboratory with seating for up to fifty-four (54) students is used for on-campus examinations. Students report to this location for scheduled testing when required. The temporary computer lab is equipped to support secure, proctored assessments and meets institutional standards for testing administration.

Faculty Area

The new campus includes a dedicated faculty workroom with five (5) workstations. Each workstation is equipped with a desk, task chair, guest chairs, and computer. Additionally, three (3) private general-use faculty offices are available. The private offices are used for confidential student conferences.

Conference Rooms

The new campus contains two conference rooms, to be used for hosting guests, faculty, and staff meetings. The conference room seats 12 at a table with room for 6 additional seats along the side. Technology capability allows for video conferencing, computer screen projection, and teleconference capability.

Student Lounge

The new campus includes a student lounge and dining area equipped with a refrigerator, two (2) microwave ovens, two (2) sinks, cabinet space, and a seating area. Students, faculty, and staff may access this area during regular business hours, Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., for meals, study, and social interaction.
