## ADMISSION PROCESS

To be considered for admission to LPN to RN Transition Program, applicants must meet the following requirements by the program deadline. There are two phases in the admission process.

### PHASE I

1. Attend the Information Session

2. Take the HESI LPN to ADN Entrance exam and achieve a score of “750” or higher.

The HESI LPN to ADN entrance exam is a nursing exam for Licensed Practical nurses seeking entrance into the LPN to RN Transition program. Students are given up to 2 hours and 15 minutes to take the Exam.

Study Materials include the NCLEX PN book or PN Course Textbooks. Exam content areas include Fundamentals, Pediatric Nursing, Maternity, Professional Issues, Medical- Surgical, Psychiatric/Mental Illness. **The cost of the exam is \$62.00**

3. Submit an Online Application with 3 references, along with the non-refundable application fee of \$100.00.

The references must be one supervisory work reference and two character references. No reference may be related to the applicant.

4. Submit the required official transcripts: College prerequisite courses and high school graduation

#### High School Transcript

The student must provide an official High School Transcript or GED transcript. High school diplomas/transcript from other countries are acceptable toward the student eligibility high school requirement, as long as it is equivalent to a U.S high school diploma as determined by a Standard College recognized evaluation agency.

**College Prerequisite Courses.** The seven (7) required prerequisite courses consist of the courses listed below:

1. Anatomy & Physiology I
2. Anatomy & Physiology II
3. Microbiology
4. Introduction to Psychology
5. College Mathematics
6. College English Composition
7. Speech/Public Speaking/Communication

Students must achieve a grade of “C” or better in each course. The courses must be at least 3 credits and from an Institution of Higher Learning accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.

5. Submit copy of LPN License. The applicant must be a LPN with a current license in good standing and qualified to practice in Virginia.

6. Attend an Interview.

Following receipt and review of all required documentation within the established timeframe, the applicant will be notified in writing of the admission decision. Applicants provisionally accepted to the program move on to Phase II.

### PHASE II

1. Successfully complete the Fundamental Skills and Concepts Validation Course with a grade of 79.50% or better.

2. Complete a Criminal Background Check and Drug Test for purposes of participating in the Clinical placement.

3. Submit proof of health insurance policy prior to attending clinical practicum.

3. Complete and submit Physical Exam, required immunizations, and TB testing.

4. Submit American Heart BLS CPR certificate.

5. Timely finalizing the registration process by submitting the required financial documents and tuition payments.

The LPN to RN Transition Program consists of four terms. Students take one course at a time and must pass each course in order to proceed to the next course. A student passes a course with a grade of 79.5% or higher. Students receive an Associate's Degree upon graduating from the program.

Standard College utilizes a blended learning environment. Course lectures in the LPN to RN Transition Program are held online. Students come to campus to participate in the Skills Lab and to take select exams. Students complete the clinical practicum onsite at a healthcare facility located in Virginia or Washington, D. C. Students must have regular access to a computer with a camera and internet access in order to successfully participate in the program.

## CLINICAL SCHEDULE

Due to the competitive nature of clinical placement, clinical sessions may be held on weekdays, weekends, and evenings. Clinical assignments are based on clinical agency availability as determined by the agency. Students must be flexible regarding clinical schedule.

## COVID-19 Vaccine Policy

## RECOMMENDED STUDY TIME

A basic rule for any degree is to spend the same number of hours studying per week as you are in class. Since you will be taking 16 hours of classes each week, you should be studying 16 hours per week at a minimum. Depending on the difficulty level of the course, may need to study more than 16 hours weekly.
