



Standard Healthcare Services, College of Nursing PHYSICAL LOCATION POLICY DISCLOSURE

Standard College is authorized to deliver distance education in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The College determines each student's physical location during the admissions process based on the address provided by the student on the Standard College Program application.

Students are informed of state educational requirements for licensure or credentialing during orientation through a Professional Licensure Disclosure. This Professional Licensure Disclosure contains a list of all States for which the school has determined that its curriculum (1) meets, (2) does not meet, or (3) has not made a determination on meeting state educational requirements for professional licensure or certification. Each student signs the disclosure, which is maintained in the student's Populi account. The Professional Licensure Disclosure is also published in the College's Handbook/Catalog.

The College does not admit students who reside in States for which the school has determined that its curriculum (1) does not meet, or (2) has not made a determination on meeting state educational requirements for professional licensure or certification.

Relocation to a state in which Standard College does not have approval to operate may adversely impact the student's ability to complete the program. A student's physical location, or a change in physical location, may also affect the student's ability to obtain employment in the field, including eligibility to satisfy state-specific licensure or credentialing requirements.

The student must notify the College of any change in their physical location. Upon notification, the College will determine whether the program satisfies the educational requirements for professional licensure or credentialing in the student's new state. If the program does not satisfy those requirements, the College will notify the student in writing by email within 14 calendar days of receiving the change-of-location information.

The College also reviews changes to state educational requirements that may affect currently enrolled students. If the College determines that the program no longer satisfies the educational requirements for licensure or credentialing in a state where a student is physically located, the affected student is notified individually in writing by email within 14 calendar days of the determination.

The Physical Location Policy is applied consistently to all students enrolled in the Practical Nursing Program and the LPN to RN Transition Program.
