PRACTICAL NURSING PROGRAM

The Practical Nursing Program offers Day, Evening, and Weekend Programs.

An **Evening Program** is usually held in April and September each year. Classes meet Monday-Thursday, 4 pm- 10 pm. The program runs about 14 months.

A **Morning Program** is usually held in January and July each year. Classes meet Monday-Thursday, 8:00 am -2:00 pm. The program runs about 14 months.

A **Weekend Program** is usually held in December each year. Classes meet Fridays, 4:00 pm to 10:00 pm, Saturdays, 8:00 am to 2:00 pm, and Sundays, 2:00 pm to 8:00 pm. The program runs about 18 months.

The Practical Nursing Program consists of three terms.

Students take one course at a time and must pass each course in order to proceed to the next course.

A student passes a course with a grade of 79.5% or higher.

Students receive a diploma upon graduating from the Program.

Standard College uses a blended learning environment. Course lectures in the Practical Nursing are held online. Students come to campus to participate in the Skills Lab and to take select exams. Students complete the clinical practicum onsite at a healthcare facility in Virginia. Students must have regular access to a computer with a camera and internet access in order to successfully participate in the program.

COVID-19 Vaccine Policy

To participate onsite at the clinical facilities, students must be vaccinated against COVID-19. Information on the college's COVID-19 Vaccine Policy can be found at [here](#).

The Clinical Practicum is a mandatory part of the Program. Students must be flexible regarding the clinical schedule. Clinicals may be held on weekdays, weekends, or evenings. Prior to participating at the clinical facility, students must submit Health Requirements Forms, Criminal and Drug Background Checks, and a CPR card from the American Heart Association.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Complete the online application, along with the \$75.00 nonrefundable application fee
 - The online application includes three (3) written references:
 - One (1) work reference
 - Two (2) character references not related to the applicant.

- Submit Proof of US High School Education or Equivalent.

Applicants must submit one of the following:

- Official High School Transcript or GED transcript, or
- Official College Transcript showing a minimum of 60 credits transferable to an associate's degree, or
- Evaluation Report.

High school diplomas/transcript from other countries are acceptable toward the student eligibility high school requirement, as long as the diploma/transcript is equivalent to a U.S high school diploma as determined by a Standard College recognized evaluation agency. Students are required to have their high school diplomas/transcript credential evaluated by a company recognized by the college.

- Pass Entrance Exam.
- Attend admission interview.
- Attend mandatory orientation

Students must complete all required steps by the program deadline in order to be considered for admission. Because the College receives more qualified applicants than available spaces, admission cannot be guaranteed.

ENTRANCE EXAM

The Entrance Exam is a two and one-half hour test, covering Math and Reading. After submitting an application, applicants receive sample questions and a link to schedule the exam. Students have one attempt and must earn at least 75% on each section to pass. Those who do not pass may reapply to a Program with a future start date.

INTERVIEW

An interview will be scheduled with the Admissions Office after passing the Entrance Exam. At the interview, you will be provided with comprehensive information on the Program and students complete an Interview Form.

The total cost for the Practical Nursing is \$25,633.54

The total cost covers all tuition, fees, and E-books.

A flexible payment plan is available for tuition and school fees.
